# SAVE OUR BUSES

#### OUR CAMPAIGN TO SAVE OUR **BELOVED BUSES IS FAR FROM** OVER, AND I WILL CONTINUE TO STAND UP AND FIGHT TO KEEP OUR BUSES.

The CBD and Eastern Suburbs Light Rail celebrated its 1st birthday in December 2020, and patronage levels are just 16% of what was promised when the project was commissioned in 2013; a massive drop in patronage which has not been seen in any other forms of public transport.

What is most troubling about the Light Rail is that the current NSW government Budget Paper 2 shows that the Light Rail has the lowest customer satisfaction of any public transport mode.

Our community loves our buses, which is why I will do everything to try and keep the 16 bus services that the NSW Liberal Government has already begun removing including: the 302, 314, 317, 373, 376, 377, 393, 394, 395, 397, 399, L94, M10, M50, 891, and 893 services which are proposed to be completely cancelled. Meanwhile, the 303, 307, 313, 316, 348, 370, 374, 391, 392, 396.



and 400 services will only go to either Randwick or Kingsford, or elsewhere. Only 4 new routes will be introduced to replace the 16 being cancelled.

Despite a commitment by the NSW Liberal Government that no routes would be removed without community consultation, the M10, M50, 891, and 893 have already been cancelled with no public consultation having occurred.

# SAVE OUR PARKS

Centennial Park, Moore Park and Queens Park are some of Australia's most important sites. That that he will be dissolving the current trust and three significant parks, is currently protected by NSW State law to have an independent trust Parklands." Bigger is not better and he particular interests of our parklands will be put at greater risk of commercialisation and reduction. Parklands in the East must not be subject to some notion of 'averaging' over the entirety of Sydney. We need to protect our parklands in the East and we need to maintain a localised control to ensure heir protection. # **NSW BUDGET -STAMP DUTY & INTRODUCE A LAND TAX**

The 2020 NSW budget indicated that the Government would be introducing some big reforms to the state's taxation system, and included some disappointing results for a number of projects in Coogee.

#### STAMP DUTY AND LAND TAX

In last year's budget, the Treasurer outlined his plan to phase out stamp duty by the 2024/25 financial year, and to introduce a land tax. This is a significant change to the structure of State taxation in NSW and will impact people in very different ways depending on their home ownership status and future home ownership/ investment plans.

There is a consultation period currently open, that

will close on March 15th, 2021 and I want to hear what you think about these significant changes. You can do so by scanning the QR code and filling out my quick survey.



#### MISSING COOGEE COMMITMENTS

This budget, much like the budget last year, fails to provide funding for a number of commitments promised by the Government.

# VOLUNTARY **EUTHANASIA**

The Member for Sydney, Alex Greenwich MP, has indicated that in 2021 he will be introducing a Private Members Bill to the NSW Parliament which looks to legalise Voluntary Euthanasia. While a Bill is yet to be presented to the Parliament, this is an issue that many people across our community have very strong views about. I have made a commitment that I will not make any decisions regarding such legislation without consulting our community, which is

why I want to hear from you. I have created a short survey to help me canvas the views of our community that you can complete here by simply scanning the QR code.



First, this budget still does not allocate a single dollar of funding for the upgrades for Randwick Boys' High School and Randwick Girls' High School, which I discuss in more depth on the next page. This comes after last year's budget classified the upgrades as minor upgrades, rather than the major upgrades promised.

In addition, there is also no funding allocated for the creation of a new Service NSW centre in Randwick, which was also promised by the Government. The pandemic has meant that people have needed strong and accessible public services more than ever. I will continue to fight to ensure that a Randwick Service NSW Centre is included in this year's budget.

# **RANDWICK GIRLS AND BOYS UPGRADES**

I continue to stand with parents from across the Eastern Suburbs in calling for the NSW Government to properly invest in public education in Sydney's East.

In 2018, the NSW Liberal Government committed to major upgrades to both Randwick Girls' High School and Randwick Boys' High School, and still no funds have been allocated in either the 2019/20 or 2020/21 NSW budgets.

Every public primary school in the electorate of Coogee is near or over capacity, as is Rose Bay Secondary College, the only co-educational public school with a catchment area in the Coogee electorate. The NSW Government continues to refuse to upgrade or expand our schools to meet the growing demand.



While we have seen many other development projects being fast-tracked across NSW to help stimulate the economy during this crisis, our schools have been ignored.

Our public schools are proud institutions with fantastic students and teachers, but this current NSW Liberal Government continues to ignore their needs, allowing their facilities to go out of date and into disrepair. I will continue to advocate for public education in the Eastern Suburbs.

# **COMMUNITY BUILDING** PARTNERSHIP GRANT PROGRAM

THIS YEAR SAW OVER ONE MILLION DOLLARS OF GRANT APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED AS PART OF THE COMMUNITY BUILDING PARTNERSHIPS GRANT PROGRAM IN COOGEE, WITH ONLY \$300,000 MADE AVAILABLE AS PART OF THE PROGRAM.

This year's winners of the Community Building Partnership were:

- Clovelly Surf Life Saving Club, for the relocation and renovation of the club's patrol and first aid rooms, resulting in a larger and more usable space
- Randwick City Council, for the refurbishment of the Coogee Oval Grandstand and to create dedicated men's and women's change rooms, to facilitate greater diversity and inclusion in sport
- The Royal Hospital for Women Foundation, for improving patient and family spaces, and for the refurbishment of the patient kitchen in the Acute Care Ward at the only female specific hospital in New South Wales
